
Capital Project Value & Impact

IMPACT FROM CURRENT OPERATIONS

In 2021, Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas – Fort Scott contributed \$12.5 million in operating expenditures into the local economy. The table to the right summarizes the current economic impact, employment, and tax impact.

IMPACT AFTER PROJECT COMPLETION

As Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas – Fort Scott expands, its expenditures and corresponding economic impact grows. Community Health Center of Southeast Kansas – Fort Scott is projected to have an annual impact of about \$13.4 million dollars by 2022, an increase of \$0.9 million. The table to the right summarizes the economic impact, employment, and tax impact following the completion of the capital project, when the health center is operating at an increased capacity.

- Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) of 1.0 is equivalent to one full-time employee. In an organization that has a 40-hour work week, an employee who works 20 hours per week (i.e., 50 percent of full time) is reported as "0.5 FTE." FTE is also based on the number of months the employee works. An employee who works full time for four months out of the year would be reported as "0.33 FTE" (4 months/12 months).
