Stations/Presenters (2026)

<u>Welcome</u>	Songs Welcome & introduction - Dan Duling, Jim Harris, Katharine Spigarelli,
<u>Station 1</u>	One-room schoolhouse — Anna Swank, Elizabeth & Jamie Thompson Students will learn about the daily activities in a pioneer school. Activities will take place in the 1869 rock schoolhouse. This station will be a “double station”, which means groups will be in this station for two rotations. Two groups will be here at a time.
<u>Station 2</u>	Blacksmith — Troy Kukovich Students will learn how iron and metal were made into tools, knives, kitchenware, etc. by using a forge, hammer and anvil.
<u>Station 3</u>	Covered Wagon travels Carter & Jill Pugh Students will learn about life for pioneers traveling by covered wagon.
<u>Station 4</u>	Drovers - Mel Haase Students will learn about the early cowboys who drove the cattle across long distances.
<u>Station 5</u>	1800's Weaponry — Matthew Wells Students will see a variety of weapons used by both civilians and soldiers in the 1800s. Students will learn about how it was to be in the Civil War.
<u>Station 6</u>	Farming History & Cowboys — Judd Bailey, George Parsons Students will learn about early farming practices and see some of the old equipment.
<u>Station 7</u>	Native Americans - Barry Lynn Linduff Students will see many authentic Native American artifacts and learn about our first residents.
<u>Closing</u>	Gettysburg Address & sing along — Dan Duling, Jim Harris, Wayne Bockleman Students will be treated to an extra special performance of the most memorable speech of the Civil War along with two songs from that era: the Battle Hymn of the Republic and Dixie.
